A YEAR OF IMPACT AND GROWTH

Dear Friends of Y.O.U.,

This past year has been one of exciting impact and expansion, marked by the extraordinary achievements of our youth, the commitment of our staff and board, and the enduring warmth of our community.

We feel extremely fortunate that 2012 was another year of growth at Y.O.U., buoyed by significant increases in both governmental and private giving. We served 850 youth, a 40% increase over the prior year, and offered these youth an even more holistic set of services. We expanded our summer learning programs,

deepened our community school model, added ACT prep and youth entrepreneurship programs, and increased our mentor matches. These are just a few of the ways we stretched our capacity to serve more youth and make a deeper impact.

At the core of our work remains a belief that when kids are supported and loved, when they have caring adults in their lives, and when they feel connected to the richness of their community, they have truly unlimited potential. Indeed, youth who actively participated in our afterschool and mentorship programs achieved new milestones this year: 71% increased their

GPAs and 95% improved their social skills, according to pre- and post- evaluations.

In celebrating our accomplishments, we are truly celebrating the collective effort of this community—the donors, partners, staff, board, and volunteers that help propel our youth to succeed. Thank you for joining us in changing kids' lives and inspiring Evanston's future.

WHAT WE BELIEVE

We believe that all youth should gain the skills, self-confidence, and opportunity to participate fully, freely, and responsibly in the life of the community.

We believe that all families should have access to social and economic mobility. Education is a powerful ladder to a better life. We help families realize their dreams by supporting their children's success in school and in life.

We believe that our community should be a safe, nurturing, and happy place for young people to live. We engage youth in afterschool and summer programs that are filled with educational and recreational activities that reduce the dangers of juvenile crime and experimentation with drugs and alcohol.

WHAT WE DO

- 1. **Education:** We support youth academic achievement through homework help, enrichment, academic counseling, and parental engagement.
- **2. Wellness:** We promote youth social, emotional, and physical health through mental health counseling, mentorship, recreation, fitness, and nutrition.
- 3. Leadership: We empower youth to be leaders through entrepreneurship education, service learning, civics and current events, and cross-cultural exploration.



Y.O.U. is a youth development agency that provides services and leadership to meet the emerging needs of young people and their families in our community.



Last year we served **850 youth** and touched the lives of **2,500 family members** with over **100,000 hours** of afterschool programming, mentorship, clinical counseling, and crisis intervention services.

Academic Success

71% of youth who actively participated in our mentorship and afterschool program increased their GPAs.

Social and Emotional Success

91% of these youth demonstrated an improvement in their social skills.*

Family Success

90% of these youth improved relationships with their families.*

Community Success

95% of these youth demonstrated leadership and coping skills that make them less likely to join a gang.*

TOP 10 Y.O.U. HEADLINES AND HIGHLIGHTS OF 2012

1. Summer Program Triples

With support from donors and partners, we tripled the size of our summer program—serving over 225 youth through comprehensive summer learning programs, camps, and recreation.

2. Mentorship Grows

We made 40 new mentorship matches in 2012, building more powerful relationships between our youth and members of the community.

3. Services Expand at ETHS

After receiving a highly competitive three-year, \$450,000 federal grant, we partnered with ETHS to establish an expanded afterschool program to support students.

4. AmeriCorps Partners with Y.O.U.

Y.O.U. was selected to host 24 AmeriCorps members over 3 years, expanding its capacity.

5. Youth Garden Established

Our youth partnered with the Yellow Tractor Project to design and cultivate a large vegetable garden behind Y.O.U.'s Nichols Youth Center.

6. DEWU Draws a Capacity Crowd

More than 350 community members joined our annual celebration of peace and diversity.

7. Clinical Programs Expand

Thanks to extraordinary donors, clinical programs were expanded by adding two clinicians.

8. Community Schools Take Root

With a two-year, \$480,000 commitment from the United Way of Metropolitan Chicago and the McCormick Foundation, we launched a new model of programs and services.

9. Youth Learn Entrepreneurship

We launched a new initiative to inspire, motivate and guide local teens in starting their own businesses.

10. Youth Beautify the Community

Murals painted by our youth dotted the Evanston landscape—from an Evanston mural at Central and Green Bay to an anti-bullying mural at 1027 Sherman Ave.

We're very pleased to be a core partner with Y.O.U. in its important work in the Evanston community. We're also proud that more than 200 Northwestern students served as counselors, mentors, and volunteers last year in Y.O.U.'s programs. Together, Y.O.U. and Northwestern are providing opportunities that enable youth from all backgrounds to succeed."




AFTERSCHOOL ENRICHMENT

Beginning immediately after the school day ends, Y.O.U. provides daily academic, social, and emotional enrichment activities at five school-based sites and two community-based locations.

Our afterschool program begins each day with 75 minutes of academic support that includes homework assistance and individualized tutoring in specific subject areas.

The next 75 minutes of program focuses on interactive, character-building activities ranging from arts and culture to life skills discussion groups.



From Good to Great

In 2012, 91% of Y.O.U.'s elementary school youth met or exceeded standards in Math.

This is an 8-point improvement from 2011 and far surpasses best-practice benchmarks for the youth we serve.

SUMMER PROGRAM

Our summer program engages youth in funfilled workshops in arts and culture, science and technology, and sports and recreation.


Youth build robots, practice dance routines, play basketball, go on weekly field trips, and much more.

Studies show that participation in such summer learning programs adds up to a five month learning gain for students when they return to school in the fall.

During the summer of 2012, Y.O.U. youth built robots through a partnership with Northwestern University, and they produced short films through a partnership with the McGaw YMCA. They designed and painted public murals, explored cultural identity, and participated in fitness and recreation.

Youth also engaged daily with life skills and social justice topics, ranging from healthy eating to sexual education to navigating bullying in schools.

Finally, high school students participated in ACT prep classes and in an entrepreneurship program that empowered them to build their own business plans.



Working with the robots was my favorite part of Y.O.U. this summer because it was kind of difficult but when I got the hang of it I felt really smart."

7th grader Chute Middle School Collaboration is core to everything we do at Y.O.U. More than 20 non-profit partners provide an array of services and resources that make our work better and that improve our kids' lives. As an example, Y.O.U.'s occupancy costs are just 4% of our budget, compared to an average cost of 13% among similar afterschool providers. We realize this lower cost by efficiently sharing space with schools, churches, and libraries rather than running all programs in our own space. We use this "extra" 9% of our budget to serve nearly 100 more youth every year.

Similarly, we rely on scores of university students from Northwestern, Loyola, and Garrett to serve as core staff members in our programs. As the federal Work-Study program reimburses these student salaries, this partnership allows us to provide individualized services at a very low cost. None of this would be possible without our partners!



CLINICAL COUNSELING

Highly experienced counselors and social workers address the emotional and mental health needs of Y.O.U. youth and their families.

Y.O.U.'s clinical team provides 24-7 crisis counseling, one-on-one case management, and family support services at client homes and at sites throughout the community.

Counselors and social workers also work to connect youth and families to other resources in the community, ensuring that all youth and families are able to address their needs in a holistic and healthy way. In 2012, Y.O.U. added a Director of Clinical Services and a second Youth and Family Case Manager.

A Clinical Story

In 2012, Y.O.U. clinicians engaged youth from Nichols and Chute Middle Schools in an extensive, 10-week anger management program called Washington Aggression Interruption Training (WAIT). The results were powerful.

Since completing the training, youth have reported avoiding fights in school and managing conflicts safely and productively. The training culminated in a graduation ceremony at which proud caregivers discussed the transformative improvements they saw in their children's behavior.

MENTORSHIP

Our Mentor Y.O.U.th program recognizes that youth need caring adults in their lives. We carefully match youth with a caring adult mentor based on each individual's unique personality, needs, and interests.

Each mentor-mentee pair meets once a week, for at least one hour, and participates in arts and cultural activities, sports and recreation, educational enrichment, and other activities of mutual interest. Mentors commit to at least 12 months of service so that each mentor-mentee relationship is continuous and stable.

A Mentorship Story

Our mentorship program encourages deep and transformative relationships by linking mentors and youth together around fun, enriching activities. For example, one mentor and youth pair in 2012 created their own food blog, started building a model car together, and formed a joint fantasy football team.

Over time, this mentor even became involved as a coach in his youth's life—encouraging him to join an athletic team and helping him to improve his grades. The mentor has found the experience enriching and the youth is now succeeding in both sports and school. Mentorship has been life-changing for both of them.

We appreciate our partnership with Y.O.U. Thanks to their efforts, hundreds of youth in our District have a safe, enriching, and nurturing after-school and summer experience. The difference that Y.O.U. makes for youth in our community improves the quality of life for everyone in Evanston."
